## *Four-year-old Kindergarten*

Assessments help teachers understand what children know and what they need to learn. The results allow teachers and staff to adapt lessons to increase student achievement. At this grade level, students generally spend less than 2 hours per school year taking standardized tests for district, state, and federal accountability.
