No previous experience with computers is required to attend this class.)</p> <p>During this course parents will learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Basic computer skills ➤ The use of the internet (parents/guardians will learn how to focus their internet searches so they can effectively and safely access websites with downloadable and free reading and math materials to use at home with their children) ➤ The use of free reading and math materials they find on the internet to support their child’s learning ➤ Installation of antivirus software in English or Spanish

Objectives	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Parents/guardians will be introduced to/learn basic computer skills. ➤ Parents/guardians will learn how to access the internet. ➤ Parents/guardians will be shown how to search for and access good/safe websites where they can find free reading and math activities. ➤ Parents/guardians will learn how to use free resources in reading and math with their children to help with reading and math homework and generally review reading and math skills.
