Position Summary/Purpose:

Works on critical School Nutrition projects related to menus that will allow the department to advance the School Nutrition Program and improve quality. Supports the menu, vendor and procurement functions of the department.

Essential Functions:

An essential function is a duty or responsibility that is fundamental to the job — a critical, or basic component of that job. An essential function cannot or should not be assigned elsewhere.

Note: An Essential Function must meet the following criteria:

- ✓ *Does the job exist to do this function?*
- ✓ *Would taking this function from the job fundamentally change the job?*
- ✓ *Would there be significant consequences if this function were not performed?*
- ✓ *Can other employees do this function if necessary?*
- ✓ *How much time per week is spent doing this function?*
- ✓ *Do people in similar positions elsewhere do this function?*

- Plans, organizes and assists in the direction of special projects related to menus, production, inventory and vendors.
- Coordinates, implements and conducts preliminary monitoring of new School Nutrition programs or systems.
- Conducts research, analyzes data and provides a variety of statistical reports, records and files.
- Implements standard procedures and best practices to enhance menus, production and inventory management.
- Designs presentation and other documents.
- Communicates with all levels of School Nutrition staff and other departments as deemed necessary for project completion.
- Serves as a back-up to the Dietician Specialist I for menu planning and procurement.
- Maintains professional knowledge by attending educational workshops and establishing professional networks.

- Provides exceptional customer service through positive communication and fostering a welcoming environment.
- Actively supports the MPS Strategic Plan.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

Job Requirements:

Education Requirements:

- An associate's degree in Nutrition or the equivalent work experience in a food related field

Experience Requirements:

- Previous experience working in a high-volume, customer focused environment is required
- Five or more years of experience working with a school nutrition food program

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Excellent oral and written communications skills are required.
- Must be able to work independently, taking tasks through to completion.
- Accuracy and organization skills are critical.
- Must be comfortable with all levels of staff and be able to establish relationships with a diverse group of individuals.
- Must be able to work independently.
- Must be able to handle multiple deadlines and tight time constraints.
- An in-depth understanding of distribution methods is required.
- PC experience with advanced spreadsheet and database expertise is required.
- Familiarity with Infinite Campus, Parent Dispute Resolution System, TRIP and other applicable district programs is desired.

Working Environment:

The work environment characteristics described here are representative of those an employee encounters while performing the essential functions of this job.

- Typical office or school environment
- Lifting of up to 30 pounds may be required.
- Position may be required to work additional hours, outside of the normal business day as a regular part of the job
