## School Description

Bradley Tech is the premier technology and trade high school in Milwaukee. Located in the heart of the Walker's Point neighborhood, the school educates more than 800 students from across the city. To support students in achieving academic and personal success, we partner with MATC and offer college credit classes. Students can obtain 12 or more college credits while developing workplace skills in carpentry, graphic arts, web design, mobile app design, machine tooling, welding and design drafting. We also offer a broad range of scholastic options and clear pathways into four-year universities, and apprenticeships. Students have access to Advanced Placement (AP), Honors level and Project Lead The Way courses, along with pre-college programs such as Diversity Scholars, My Life! My Plan, Lead to Succeed and Upward Bound. We have been honored as a PBIS School of Merit for utilizing Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) to reinforce positive behaviors.


### Points of School Pride

- In May 1999, an Intergovernmental Cooperation Agreement among MATC, UW-Milwaukee and MPS established an entity known as the Bradley Tech Commission to provide operational oversight of Bradley Tech.
- Dual enrollment courses are offered through MATC as early as sophomore year.
- An emphasis on youth apprenticeships and internships allows students to gain on the job training in the different trade and tech specialties.
- As an MPS Community School, Bradley Tech works to better engage and align resources centered on the self-identified, real-time needs of communities focusing on the education of a child, understanding that a child belongs to a family, and that family lives and interacts within a larger community.
