Academic excellence is Hampton’s mission. Academic Gap Reduction (AGR) and intervention time allow for smaller class sizes and more personalized instruction to giving students the one-on-one mentoring needed for success. Students learn computer skills and technology which is integrated in daily lessons and classroom teaching. Each classroom has computer carts with Chromebooks for individual technology instruction. Monthly parent newsletters, special events, Saturday recreation and family night activities create a strong bond between home and school. Hampton students have a uniform policy of red shirt and black pants which contributes to a safe and peaceful school environment.


Points of School Pride

- Hampton was a recipient of the 2016 Response to Intervention (RTI) School of Distinction award in Reading.
- Throughout the years, Hampton teachers modeled distinguished teaching instruction in Core Knowledge Language Arts (CKLA) for the benefit of others, including coaches from Chicago’s AUSL Schools.
- Hampton students attended educational screenings by Milwaukee Film at the Oriental Theatre and entered the essay contest. Two fourth grade students won first and second place for the city-wide essay competition.
