
Points of School Pride

- Expanded Advanced Placement (AP) and Project Lead the Way (PLTW) course offerings with AP Exam Pass Rate growing from 3.6 percent to 13.8 percent for 2015-2016.
- Makerspace: We will be unveiling a Science Lab for the fall of 2017-2018 in addition to the existing Media Makerspace creating an opportunity to integrate science, media and communication into established course offerings.
- Increased fine arts offerings, especially in the area of music with 26.3 percent of students currently enrolled in music classes including guitar, piano, and percussion courses,
- In the 2016-2017 school year 22 out of 30 GED02 students are on track to complete their program.

Springboard curriculum in English language arts and mathematics, Advanced Placement (AP) courses, Project Lead the Way include engineering , biomedical science and computer science, fine arts, commercial art, GE technology, adaptive art, beginning and intermediate band, orchestra, piano, guitar and percussions, GED02 and credit recovery, advancement via individual determination, Positive Behavioral Intervention and Supports (PBIS), National Honor Society and School to Work Transition Program, after school extracurricular activities include chess and mock trial, boys and girls basketball, track, football, girls volleyball, boys and girls soccer, and boys and girls tennis
