
Points of School Pride

- Scholarships offered to our high school graduates increased from \$3.5 million in 2013 to \$10.8 million in 2016.
- Thirty-one different cultures are embraced within the student population, including many students who are immigrants, refugees, or first generation Americans.
- The only high school in Wisconsin authorized to host all three academically-challenging IB Programs: the Middle Years Programme, the Career-related Programme, and the Diploma Programme.
- Twenty regional, state or national awards have been presented to our staff members over the course of the past four years.
