## School Description

Riverside University High School for the past two years has been the most requested high school in Milwaukee Public Schools. Riverside offers more Honors and Advanced Placement courses than any other area high school. Students learn in a safe, orderly environment with a focus on college preparation. More than 85% of graduates are accepted into college. With a state-of-the-art lab for its Project Lead the Way engineering and biomedical programs, students get hands-on learning experiences while earning college credits. With close proximity to UW-Milwaukee, students may take college courses on the UWM campus. Riverside also is known for its award-winning music, bilingual and special education programs. Riverside, “the school that has it all,” features outstanding athletic teams, musical, after-school activities and student leadership. Parents are welcomed as partners in the teaching and learning process. The school has a Parent Resource Center for families.
