Chromebook Checkout Agreement



To: All Parent(s)/Guardian(s) & students

Our goal of preparing online learning opportunities is to provide options to reinforce academic skills, minimize instructional loss, and provide routines and structures to help students stay engaged and connected. This device remains the property of Milwaukee Public Schools district.

Families are allowed to checkout a Chromebook so their student(s) have the necessary access to online materials.

The following Enrollment Agreement must be read and signed by a student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s).

By signing this Enrollment Agreement, the parent and/or legal guardian agrees to the following;

- The user is responsible for the care and safekeeping of the Chromebook.
- Use of the computer network and the Internet shall be for educational purposes only.
- Students will not attempt to gain access or access any computer sites or files for which they do not have authorization.
- The Chromebook will still be filtered as it is inside of school. A wifi connection is needed for most work. However, there is a way to use Google docs, sheets, and slides in an offline mode if needed. Students are bound by MPS Acceptable Use Policy and 1:1 policy and regulations wherever they use their Chromebooks.
- If any malfunction within the computer occurs, the student and/or parent or guardian must email the Technology Support Center at tsc.milwaukee.k12.wi.us immediately and not attempt to remedy any malfunction through their own efforts. Please include a phone number, school name, student ID and description of malfunction in the email so we can contact you with next steps.

In consideration of being given use of the Chromebook identified, I/we agree to forever release and discharge Milwaukee Public Schools, its agents, employees, Board of School



Directors, administrators and volunteers, individually and collectively, from any claims, damages, or of action which may arise from our/my son's/daughter's use of the subject Chromebook. This includes claims relating to:

1. The content of any information or advice received by a student from a source outside of the school district or any costs that incurred as a result of seeking or accepting such advice;
2. Any harm resulting from the student's accessing objectionable material over the Internet;
3. Any harm to the student resulting from the student's use of the Internet;
4. Any costs, liability or damages caused by student use of the computer, network, or Internet
5. Any consequences of service interruptions or changes whether or not they were under the control of the school district staff and /or the privacy of electronic mail.
6. Information and Media Literacy - Accessing information efficiently and effectively, evaluating information critically and competently and understanding how media messages are constructed.
7. Examining how individuals interpret messages differently, how values and points of view are included or excluded and how media can influence beliefs and behaviors.
8. Possessing a fundamental understanding of the ethical/legal issues surrounding the access and use of information.
